GIRL SCOUTS 100<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY EXHIBIT AT  
THE FLORIDA HISTORIC CAPITOL MUSEUM

**POSTER THEME:** Girl Scouts and the State Parks. Has your troop visited one of Florida's beautiful State Parks? Or, has your troop participated in a service project in support of our State Parks? Show us what you have done or plan a project in celebration of our 100 Years.

**WHO:** All Girl Scout Councils in Florida are invited to have their Girl Scouts or Troops design posters following the criteria. Up to two posters from each council will be selected by the museum's exhibit manager to be rotated at the exhibit at the Florida Historic Capitol Museum.

**WHERE:** Selected posters will be displayed at the Girl Scout exhibit at the Florida Historic Capitol Museum in Tallahassee, FL. January through August, 2012. Exhibit manager will rotate selected posters so that all can be displayed sometime during the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Exhibit.

**CRITERIA:** Poster must summarize how Girl Scouts have utilized or contributed to the State Park system.

Use poster board of any color. Size: 22" wide X 28" tall. Use single or mixed-media art forms, for example, work that combines, paint, ink, photos, and collage could be called a "mixed media" work. Design must be in portrait (28" tall) not landscape style.

Be sure to put the following information on the back of each poster: council, name of girl(s) who created the poster, troop number and program level, troop leader's name, e-mail address and phone number.

**DEADLINE:** Posters must be postmarked by October 31, 2011. (This is a good summer project.) Posters should be submitted directly to the Museum Exhibit Manager at the Florida Historic Capitol Museum:
