Pathways...

Girl Scouts of the USA has introduced different Pathways in which girls can join or participate in Girl Scouts without being part of a troop. It is the girls' choice and girls can choose more than one pathway.

Girls can browse through the Spring Program Calendar, with their family, and sign up for whatever interests them and fits their schedule. Girls can share the info with friends and even sign up together. There's bound to be one or many Pathways that is right for each individual girl.

How to Use the Program Calendar

Programs are listed by month. Programs, and or Events, are from January 2012 through June 2012. This includes both Council-Sponsored Programs (programs produced by Girl Scouts of CC Program Department And/or volunteers) and Community Partner Programs/ Events (programs/events created in partnership with community organizations and the GSCC Program Team).

Event= Fun activity sponsored by council or Community Partner- Does not include Journey curriculum.

- **Date, Time and Location:** County or City; street addresses are provided with confirmations
- **Other:** Includes important extra information.
- **Girl and Adult Min/Max:** Includes the minimum number of girl and adult participants needed for an event to happen, as well as the maximum capacity. Please register only the number of adults needed to meet *Safety-Wise* requirements to allow more room for girls.
- **Cost and Registration Deadline:** The cost of programs (sometimes including materials) and a date which ends program sign-up registration.

- ❖ Unless otherwise indicated, individual girls may register for all Council Sponsored Programs through council office. Transportation to and from the event must be provided, and a parent/guardian must indicate on the Program Registration Form whether or not they will be attending this event. Our vendors do not process Girl Scouts of Citrus Council forms; please see individual program descriptions for registration methods.

- ❖ **No tag-a-longs are permitted at program sites; only those girls and adults registered for a program may attend. A tag-a-long is an extra participant who is not registered for the program. This includes siblings, friends, and adults who do not meet but exceed the Safety-Wise (adult/girl) ratio.**

- The **registration deadline** for council-sponsored programs is **always** three weeks prior to the event, unless otherwise specified.
