World Thinking Day!

One of the most important days of the Girl Scout year is February 22. World Thinking Day is a day of international friendship. It is an opportunity to celebrate the Girl Guides and Girl Scouts Movement, speak out on issues that affect young women and fundraise for 10.8 million Girl Guides and Girl Scouts in 153 countries.

Thinking Day originated in 1926 from a desire of the Girl Guides and Girl Scouts to dedicate a day to thinking about and appreciating the global spread of these movements. The day began when the delegates from the Girl Guide and Girl Scout organizations from across the globe attended the 4th world conference where it was decided that the day would be created and would be held on the birthday of Lord and Lady Baden-Powel, the founders of the Boy Scout and Girl Guide movements.

Since it was first launched, World Thinking
Day has become a way to support Girl Guides
and Girl Scouts across the globe. It allows groups
of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts to get to know
and connect with others within the Girl Guiding
and Girl Scouting community, even if they're
situated countries apart.

The aim of this day is to bring together young people from across the world – nearly 150 countries choose to take part in the celebrations to celebrate international fun and friendship, as well as to help raise money and focus on the year's global theme.
