Things you need to know about the cookie program for Iuliettes

Happy New Year Juliettes and families! January is not only the beginning of a new year but it is the start of the sweetest time of the Girl Scout year. It is COOKIE SEASON. The Girl Scout cookie program is much more than just "selling cookies". It is a chance for Girl Scouts to learn important life skills.

Goal setting is important in many areas of life. Girls learn to set goals that are realistic and achievable but still help them stretch and grow. Its more than just picking out what "prize" she wants, it is a way to help her learn what she is capable of doing.

<u>Decision making</u> is the second lie skill of the cookie program. Once the goal has been set the girl has to figure out just how she is going to reach that goal. Is she going to concentrate on digital orders or booths or asking her friends and family to support her efforts. She learns to weigh the pros and cons of each choice and finally make the best decision for her.

<u>Money management</u> is a big part of the cookie program. Younger girls learn to make change and older girls learn things like budgeting .All girls learn how money plays a part in almost everything they do.

<u>People skills</u> are a huge part of the cookie program. The cookie program gives girls a chance to practice talking to people of all ages and backgrounds. Their excitement about the cookies seems to help overcome any shyness they may have. Older girls learn how to tailor their message to the intended audience.

<u>Business ethics</u> are a way that girls put the Girl Scout Law into play. They learn how important it is to do the right thing in business. Being honest and fair and respecting others and being a sister to every other Girl Scout all translate into good business ethics.
