STEPS

1 Discover the Language of Flowers

Did you know that each flower has its own meaning? Floriography (the language of flowers) is a means of cryptological communication through the use or arrangement of flowers. Meaning has been attributed to flowers for thousands of years, and some form of floriography has been practiced in traditional cultures throughout Europe, Asia, and Africa.

(2) Learn about floral arrangements

- b. Find flower arrangements around you!
 - Visit your local flower shop or grocery store. Take a look at some of the pre-made bouquets you see. What kind of flowers are most common? Are the arrangements themed around a certain occasion? Do the meanings behind the flowers match the theme?

(3) Create your bouquet!

Option 2: Do-it-Yourself!

- a. Want to get even more creative? Go out to your local flower shop or grocery store and pick out flowers on your own!
- b. You can also visit your local craft store or Wal-Mart to pick up fake flowers to have a bouquet that lasts forever!
- c. Try to get at least three different types of flowers with different meanings. Take them home and arrange them how you want. There are tons of tutorials online or you can get creative and figure something out on your own!

Option 3: Create a virtual bouquet!

- b. Make sure you look up the meaning of each flower before adding them to your bouquet so you aren't sending the wrong message!
