Osceola Library System History

Osceola County has a long history of library service. From early in the twentieth century until 1969, library services in Osceola County were provided by two small libraries, both operated independently by women's organizations. After 1969, the Orange County Library System provided library service to Osceola residents on a contractual basis.

On March 26, 1979, County Ordinance 79-2 was adopted to create the current Library District in order to provide comprehensive Library services to all County residents. The governing board of the Library District is the Board of County Commissioners. The Board levies the property taxes necessary to operate the Library District, adopts the annual budget, and approves debt issuances.

On April 1, 1989, the Osceola Library System began operations as an independent organization offering Library service to all residents of Osceola County.

The Osceola Library System opened with three small branches and a total book collection of 70,000 volumes. Today, the Library boasts six branches, a collection of over 275,000 volumes, and serves over 120,000 library customers.



How to sign up for a Library Card

Resident Library Card

Visit any Library branch to sign up for or renew a Library card. Library cards are valid system-wide at all Osceola Library System locations.

Library Card Attributes:

- 50 Checkouts
- 20 Holds
- Auto-Renewals* up to 3 times (*Excluding items that have hold requests)

Proof of address and a valid photo ID (imprinted with name) are required for sign-ups and renewals for all cards. For youth ages 15 and younger, a parent or guardian must be present to receive any of our offered Library cards.

Resident Educator Card

(For Public, Private and Homeschool educators)

Educator Cards help get more resources to the Osceola students who need them, whether it be because their school does not have a library, or their school library does not have a healthy collection that supports their curriculum and needs. Visit any Library branch to sign up for or renew an Educator Card. Like personal Library Cards, Educator Cards are valid system-wide at all Osceola Library System locations and are valid for 2 years.

This card only extends to educators whose employment is based in Osceola County. An educator may have an Educator Card in addition to their personal Library Card.

Rules and Conduct

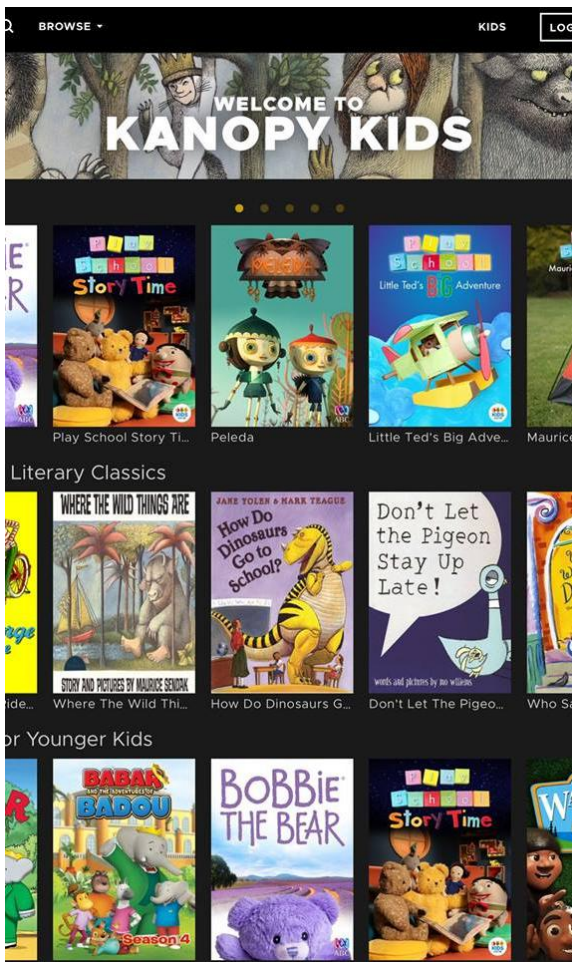
